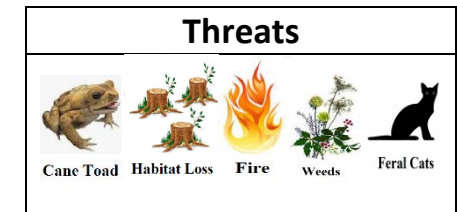
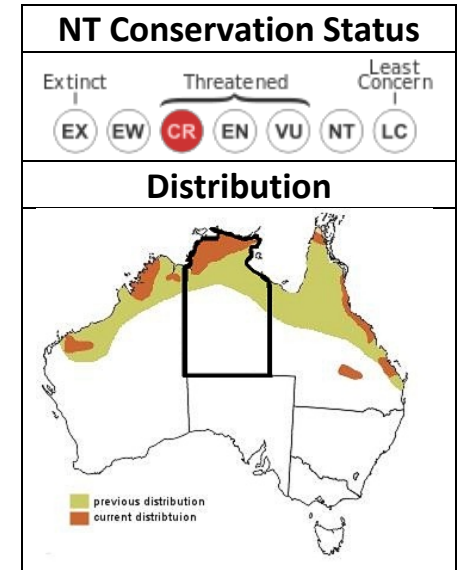




NORTHERN QUOLL



NORTHERN QUOLL, <i>Dasyurus hallucatus</i>

Identification
<i>This Carnivorous marsupial is the smallest quoll of 4 species and is covered in brownish grey fur with white spots appearing on its back. Its head is long and pointed with bulging eyes and pointed ears. Tail is long and brown.</i>
Behaviour
<i>An aggressive nocturnal hunter. Males and females maintain home ranges, with males occupying an area that may overlap several female territories.</i>
Reproduction
<i>Breeds May-June producing 4-8 young which stay in mums pouch for up to 9 weeks.</i>
Habitat
<i>Prefers rocky areas in open forests, woodlands and savannah.</i>
