

School Group Code of Conduct

A visit to the Territory Wildlife Park is designed to provide a 'mini wilderness' experience. The Park is a controlled area and as such there are a number of restrictions on where visitors can go.

Clearly identified walking tracks and pathways are provided to guide your group's movement around the Park and to protect the surroundings from being stressed or damaged by people walking through them. Please ensure students stay on these tracks and pathways at all times.

The Territory Wildlife Park has a free hop-on hop-off shuttle train service to help visitors make the most of their time at the Park. The train departs the Main Station (admissions area) every 30 minutes from 9:30am to 3:30pm in the Dry Season (1st April – 30th September) and 2:30pm in Wet Season (1st October – 31st March), (eg 9:30am, 10am, 10:30am and so on) and stops at all of the major exhibits. We ask that groups be ready to board the train 5 minutes prior to departure.

We recommend that you divide students into smaller groups of 5-8 students per supervising adult. This will help prevent congestion around exhibits and make supervision more effective. Smaller groups are also less stressful for the wildlife and other Park visitors. The Park is a shared experience and other visitors expect to enjoy the Park in a relaxed and unspoilt way.

Please remind your students of what is meant by 'appropriate behaviour' at the Park. You are more than welcome to ask a member of staff to reinforce this message at the start of your visit.

Students remain the responsibility of their teachers at all times. Teacher supervision is necessary at all times.
